CURRICULUM DELIVERY	The sequencing of learning and breakdown of topics into small steps is designed to develop a deep understanding of the language and give a range of opportunities to practice the key skills of reading, writing, listening and speaking. Concepts are revisited and interleaved to facilitate opportunities for the students' to demonstrate their understanding and continue to build a wider vocabulary throughout their time studying languages. At BVC we aim to inspire learners to be both linguistically able and culturally aware so that they have a keen interest both in languages and in the wider world. By learning languages here, learners will have the opportunity to develop a wide range of skills, particularly their communication skills and consolidate their understanding of their own language and its grammar. Students will also learn about different cultures and gain a wider perspective and understanding of other countries and cultures.
