- * The school nominating me to attend Holocast Memorial Trust programme of learning which involved meeting amazing survivors, learning about contemporary relevance of the Holocaust, including meeting victims of the Rwandan genocide and culminating in a trip to Aushwitz—it was a huge honour for which I am still grateful for.

Memorable or inspirational teachers?

Mrs Witherington! She was our form tutor that guided form AW through from our arrival as 11 year olds to us leaving at 16. Also, being the Food Technology teacher it meant that our tutor time was in the food room so we have baked goods a lot!

Where did you go after BVC?

I went to do my A-levels (History, Politics, Economics & Geography) at Hills Road and then via a gap year working into Durham University where I read History & Politics.

Where do you live now?

I live in London with my Husband

What is your current career?

I am part of the Senior Civil Service. My current role is leading the Infrastructure & Energy Team in the Cabinet Office.



What led you to that?

I joined the Civil Service Fast Stream as a graduate after University. It was an area that has always interested me but also it was 2009 and the global financial crisis meant there were not a lot of options!

Have you travelled during your studies/career?

Yes lots of travel at both university and work.

Any advice you'd like to pass onto BVC students now?

It's tempting to over think it but I found that by going for subjects I was best at (History & Geography) and thought I would like most (Politics & Economics) at A-Level, I did well and it opened up options I could not have envisaged at BVC.
