Our Year 10 side lost 10-28, playing against a very tough Comberton side who had a number of club players in their squad. At half time Bassingbourn were losing 4-20. However, they played a much better second half with more determination and better defensive play, which kept the score down (second half score 8-6 so a much closer battle). Player of the match chosen by Comberton was Joyce.
